Roadmaster: The new John Deere Flail Mower has been delivered. The new trailer, to mount the leaf blower on, was purchased at Tractor Supply. The roads need graded once the weather cooperates. Gary did not look at the F800 but he will soon so a decision can be made as to whether it is sold and replaced or kept. Ray Murphy was given the go ahead to mow Schreck's and Ed Rightmire's driveways again at the same hourly rate as before. Ray will purchase the required materials to make a bracket for the F450 light and to make a crank for the F350 tarp. A new tarp needs purchased then for the F350. Headwall markers and posts need ordered.

Ray and Emerson will go over the Turkey Farm Rd rock embankment stabilization project tomorrow to mark the trees the Game Farm employees will be cutting down. Ray will try to meet with Brent from Gutelius after August 11<sup>th</sup> to discuss the project.

Sewage Officer: No Report

A letter from Sanitary about their lack of operating funds, due to a withholding of reimbursement funds from the state, was read. A special meeting was called and the Townships that attended feel that they want Sanitary to continue even if a monthly fee needs to be assessed to cover operating costs.

CONTINUING BUSINESS: The total bid from Gutelius Excavating for the Turkey Farm Rd Stream Bank Stabilization Project was increased from \$13,050 to \$15,900. Gutelius did not realize prevailing wages were part of the bid. The Township Solicitor looked into the situation and suggested, since there were no other bids even close to Gutelius' that they update their bid and the Supervisors sign the contract with the updated prices and updated total.

NEW BUSINESS: Ray made a motion, with unanimous affirmative vote, to authorize Township Solicitor, Brett Feese, to sue Robin Real Estate, if necessary, for the \$2500 stream discharge system escrow.

All of the Supervisors are in agreement to have Gary sign the letters to Lycoming Sanitary for the Devlin and Wagner properties. These letters state that the Supervisors are reasonably certain that there was water under pressure at these properties prior to 1972.
