

The regular meeting of the Plunketts Creek Township Board of Supervisors was called to order Monday, February 1, 2010 at 7 PM in the Township Building.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read.

GUESTS: Annie Aumen read the PCT Elected Auditors reorganizational meeting minutes.

Sewage Officer: A letter was written to the Snyder's requiring new sewage testing for their lot subdivided in 2009.

Roadmaster: Ray thanks all EMA and PCTVFD personnel for their help with the high water and road closings on January 25, 2010. Great Job everyone! Some roads were severely damaged but all are passable and nearly back to normal thanks to the dedicated road crew that braved the cold weather to get the roads back in shape. Great Job guys!

Road Damage Report – Barbours Cemetery Road: A 300' X 16' section of tar and chip was destroyed. 500' of burems needed fixed. Approximately 60 tons of subbase needed to repair the burems and make the road passable. Turkey Farm Road: A 50' X 16' section of tar and chip was destroyed. 100' of burems needed fixed. Approximately 60 tons of subbase needed to repair the burems and make the road passable. Scaife Road: Mud was removed from 3/10 mile section of road. A 20' X 10' section of 3" thick blacktop was destroyed. Burems on both sides of the road over a ½ mile section need fixed. Approximately 60 tons of subbase needed to repair the burems and make the road passable. Cabbage Hollow Road: A 100' section of burems need fixed due to mountain run off, not a creek. Approximately 20 tons of subbase needed to fix the road. Hickory Lane: All OK. Dunwoody Road: Big Bear creek came over its banks and ran down the middle of the road for about 1000'. Approximately 20 tons of subbase needed to fix the road.

Lower Manor Road: At an area we call "The Cove" 1000' of burems need fixed and another 30' of burems on both sides need fixed from Loyalsock Manor Rd to Mostellers. A 30' section of burems 5' deep and undermining of this 4" plus deep section of 18' wide Blacktop at Loyalsock Pines Lane need repaired. We have no estimate as to what this is going to take to repair. Upper Manor Road: All OK.

NEW BUSINESS: Gary made a motion, with unanimous affirmative vote, to bid 37 tons bulk rock salt through the costars piggyback program for 2010-2011.

Marvin made a motion, with unanimous affirmative vote, to bid for 3000 tons of 2RC subbase and 500 tons 2A subbase through the West Branch COG.

Marvin made a motion, with unanimous affirmative vote, to adopt resolution 2010-3 allowing county to collected real estate taxes for the Township and sign the agreement with county to appoint them as tax collector.

Clean Up Day is set for Saturday, May 1, 2010 from 8 AM to 4 PM.

The PCT Playground Committee did not receive the DCNR Small Communities grant they applied for in the name of Plunketts Creek Township. They will do their playground rehabilitation project with the \$40,000 already received.
